### **Fire and Emergency Safety Awareness & Techniques**

#### **Course Outline**

This course is designed to give participants the skills and confidence to deliver fire warden training to meet the legal requirements. This course is based on highly interactive with role-playing and practical exercises to reinforce understanding and learning.

Participants will be able to understand:

- Legislation and regulations
- Chemistry of fire and how fire spreads
- Fire prevention and evacuation
- Fire marshal duties and safe use of Fire extinguishers and fire fighting

#### **Course Outcomes**

This course is designed to raise awareness of fire hazards and train participants on how to act safely in the event of an emergency fire situation. This training course provides participants with the knowledge necessary to prevent fires in the workplace and also focus on the basic elements of fire prevention and protection. The participants will be able to use fire extinguishers properly and develop skills concerning emergency evacuation procedures.



#### **Course Structure**

#### **Self-Study**

A reading list will be provided through handouts during the duration of the course.

Selection from;

- Oral Examination (30 minutes),
- Practical Examination (60 minutes) and
- Multiple Choice Examination (90minutes).

- Basic level of English (reading, understanding and spoken English)
- Basic knowledge of computer for research (MS Word and Internet Browsing)
- Basic numerical skills

## Learning Objectives

At the end of this course the candidate would have acquired:

- A sound understanding of the role, functions and responsibility of a fire marshal.
- Ability to identify which are the elements that need to be present for a fire to occur, the three basic principles of fire extinction and the principles and practice of fire risk analysis.
- Ability to identify the key elements for effective fire risk management in the workplace.
- An understanding of the correct methods of fire prevention measures that can be taken to minimize fire hazards.
- Knowledge of the use of various types of fire equipment
- Knowledge of common types of evacuation procedures and the control of personnel.
- Follow fire prevention good practices.
- Determine the type of approach needed to properly apply fire safety procedures for every workplace.
- Apply fire control measures to manage fire inherent and residual risks.
- Understand the importance of teamwork in an emergency situation
- Cooperate with co-workers and health & safety representatives in the event of an emergency in any workplace
- Adequately apply organisational & prioritizing skills in emergency situations



- Identify and make use of correct fire equipment (extinguishers, fire blanket and personal fire protection equipment).
