Reporting accidents and ill health at work is a legal requirement. The Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1995 (RIDDOR), place a legal duty on: employers, self-employed people and people in control of premises to report work-related deaths, major injuries or over-three-day injuries, work related diseases (including certain infections) and dangerous occurrences (near miss accidents)
